

The *First Aid for Victorian Schools* skill set includes all the content of:

## Application and Relevance

This course applies to educators and school support staff who are required to respond in the event of a first aid emergency. It meets Victorian legislative obligations including Ministerial Order 706 and the first aid training requirements of the Victorian Department of Education.

**Course Currency Status:** the two accredited courses and the first aid unit of competency are all current

## Duration

Blended delivery option: 4.5 hours of online pre-work plus 8 hours of face-to-face training and assessment.  
Full course face-to-face option: 2 days (15 hours).

## Course Content

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to provide first aid response, life support, management of casualty(s), the incident and other first aiders until the arrival of medical or other assistance. Topics include:

- + Airway and breathing management
- + Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation techniques (CPR)
- + Automated External Defibrillation
- + Heart conditions, stroke, diabetes, seizures & convulsions
- + Infection control and First Aid for minor wounds
- + Risk management for asthma and anaphylaxis
- + Anaphylaxis emergency management
- + Asthma emergency management
- + Trauma, including bleeding, burns, electric shock, fractures
- + Head, spine, chest and abdominal injuries
- + Hyperthermia and hypothermia
- + Envenomation and poisons
- + Reporting requirements in education
- + Debriefing and evaluation of response to critical incidents



## Entry Requirements

There are no prerequisite units. Participants will need the ability to meet the physical demands of providing first aid. Participants will also need oral communication skills to make an accurate verbal report to emergency services and writing skills to complete incident reports and other first aid management documentation.

## Assessment Methods

Progressive assessment throughout the course, including demonstration of practical skills and written and oral questions relating to underpinning knowledge. Note that the provision of CPR must be demonstrated on the floor.

## Award Issued

A nationally-recognised Statement of Attainment will be issued to all successful participants.
