

CPR and LVR Course

Providing effective, lifesaving first aid interventions such as cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) requires instruction and practical training. This is especially true where there is a risk of electrocution during a rescue of a casualty from a live LV panel before providing first aid. These procedures carry a risk of further injury to the casualty and the first aider. As with any training, it is more useful if training occurs before being confronted with an actual real-life situation.

This CPR and LVR course is delivered in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines and will allow you to develop skills and knowledge and most importantly, confidence, to provide first aid treatment to any person suffering a sudden cardiac arrest with the added focus on electric shock and rescue from a live LV panel.

The LVR component of the course is essential for those conducting live work or working with live switchboards, covering the performance of rescue procedures from a live Low Voltage (LV) apparatus, not including overhead lines and underground cables in the workplace. It specifies the mandatory requirements of rescue from a live LV panel and how they apply in the context of transmission, distribution or rail work functions. It encompasses responsibilities for, health, safety and risk management processes at all operative levels and adherence to safety practices as part of the normal way of doing work.

Entry Requirements

HLTAIDCPR Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation is a prerequisite for the LVR component and is covered in this course.

Participants must have the physical capacity to complete a practical demonstration of a simulated LV panel rescue and perform 2 minutes of uninterrupted CPR on the floor.

What happens at the course?

Assessment Activities

Assessments conducted during face-to-face training session(s) include:

- **Performance tasks:**
 - Perform CPR on an infant
 - Implement Occupational Health and Safety workplace procedures and practices including the use of risk control measures
 - Identify and label the isolation point
 - Perform a rescue from a LV panel
 - Call for the ambulance
 - Discuss first aid options and treatment
 - Prevent access to the area
 - Verbally report the incident
- **Simulated scenario** - The assessor **must** observe the following scenarios:
 - Perform CPR on an adult
- **Theory assessment** - A written exam consisting of short answer and multiple-choice questions. All questions must be completed. Model responses are provided later in this document.
